


A specialized public diplomacy institution that leads the era of global Jeollabuk-do

- Supporting intenational events held in Jeollabuk-do and other related organizations with translation and interpretation services



Charter for Human Rights Management



We at the JBCIA, promote the international exchange of Jeollabuk-do province and the private sector, enhance the global image of the province, and foster friendly international relationship based on human rights management.

As the public diplomacy institution of Jeollabuk-do, we declare this Charter for Human Rights Management set forth below in order to protect and promote the human rights of all stakeholders, including employees related to management activities and shall make efforts to establish and spread human rights management.

- First, we respect and support the 35 covenants of universal human rights that are stipulated under the International Bill of Human Rights.
- Second, we make efforts towards carrying out the principles of non-discrimination with a sense of responsibility for protecting and promoting the human rights of all stakeholders at home and abroad.
- Third, we prevent infringement on human rights and make active efforts for providing remedies to human rights violations through a proper procedure.
- Fourth, we prohibit discrimination based on race, religion, gender, disabilities, political inclination, or place of birth and respect diversity.
- Fifth, we ban forced and child labor, and observe all rules and principles of labor ratified by the Korean Governmentand recommended by the ILO concerning health, safety, and working hours.
- Sixth, we respect the traditions and cultures of foreign countries while implementing domestic and international projects and ensure that the human rights of residents are not violated.
- Seventh, we safeguard workers' freedom of association and collective bargaining.
- Eighth, we foster safe and healthy working conditions and guarantee the industrial safety and the environmental rights of workers.
- Ninth, we fairly treat collaborators and institutions through responsible management of a supply network, carry out management based on human rights, and provide fair compensation.
- Tenth, we provide precise and correct information on projects and programs, thereby protecting the right of consumers to know.
- Eleventh, we are dedicated to achieving human-centered management focused on human rights by promoting trust, cooperation, growth, innovation, empathy, communication, accountability, and transparency.
